DAY 1 (Oct. 13) Leave USA/Arrive Lima

• Outside of Customs, our Lima guide and your tour leader greet the group and escort you by private bus to your hotel in Miraflores. (Remember to keep your passport available at all hotel registrations.)

DAY 2 (Oct. 14) Leave Lima/Arrive Cusco

- Wake early, have breakfast at hotel, take bus back to the airport, and fly to Cusco.
- Our guides pick you up at the Cusco airport and take you to your hotel for check-in.
- Orientation Group Meeting: We discuss the itinerary, adapting to high altitude, and ground rules for the trip.
- Lunch
- Walking tour of Cuzco Centro and Plaza de Armas: Our guides introduce you to the main sights of Cusco.
- Group dinner, followed by brief meeting and evening rest.

DAY 3 (Oct. 15) Cusco

- Breakfast
- Sacred Cusco: Introduction to Incan history, Seque lines, temples, and mythology including tour of the Korichancha, Temple of the Sun.

- Afternoon rest or on your own in Cusco.

- Evening presentation: introduction to Q'ero shamanism and opening ceremony at Ayniwasi.

DAY 4 (Oct. 15) Leave Cusco for the Sacred Valley/arrive Urubamba

- Arrive at Illarumiy retreat.
- Lunch

- Evening group integration with blessing and presentation on The Way of Ayni.

DAY 5 (Oct. 16) Pisac and Amaruwanka

- Breakfast
- Bus to Pisac and temple of the condor.
- Meditation, blessing, and teachings at Amaruwanka.
- Lunch
- Rest
- Dinner
- Evening integration and discussion on Q'ero cosmovision and The Three Principles.

DAY 6 (Oct17) Ollantaytambo (or hike to Nopaigeslia or Apu Pumahuanca, depending on ability of group)

- Breakfast
- Bus to Ollantaytambo ruins.
- Meditation, blessing, and teaching.
- Lunch in Ollantaytambo.
- Climb to lesser-known ruins and walking tour of the old parts of the town.
- Return to retreat for dinner.
- Rest

Day 7 (Oct. 18) Leave the Sacred Valley/Train to Aguas Calientes

- Breakfast
- Bus to train station.
- Train to Aguas Calientes.
- Check into hotel.
- Lunch
- Afternoon at leisure.
- Dinner
- Evening orientation about Machu Picchu.

Day 8 (Oct. 19) Machu Picchu

- Wake early, breakfast, and bus to the Sanctuary of Machu Picchu. Our personal guide will provide a detailed presentation of the ancient city and its meaning as the eco-spiritual icon of our times.

- Return to hotel in the afternoon.

Day 9 (Oct. 20) Leave Aguas Calientes/Train to Ollantaytambo/Bus to Cusco

Day 10 (Oct. 21) Cusco



INITIATION IN AUTHENTIC Q'ERO SHAMANISM



To deepen your understanding and practice of Q'ero shamanism, we offer serious students traditional initiation into the way of Ayni. As an initiate, you become an aynipampamisayoq, a neophyte traditional ceremonialist. At the first initiation, you become a "misa carrier," one who holds the earth as sacred and who is given the sacred bundle, misaq'epe. You also learn which of the three shamanic powers best suits your personality. Many more karpays are required to become a master shaman, but all journeys start with a single step. This unique experience is the portal into the world of the shaman.

DAILY ITINERARY October 24-27, 2013

Day 13 (Oct. 24) Cusco, Preparation and Cleansing Rituals at Ayniwasi

- Breakfast.
- Morning on your own.
- Lunch.
- Transport to Ayniwasi for instructions about the aynikarpay. Women will work with Q'ero women, and men with Q'ero male shamans. Every one comes together for instructions.
- Return to hotel.
- Dinner on your own.
- Evening rest.

Day 14 (Oct. 25) Aynikarpay, Initiation Ceremony at Killarumiyoq

- Breakfast.
- We go by minivan in the morning to Poray. From there, we travel toward Apu Salkantay to the small town of San Martin de Ancahuasi, where we go on a dirt road toward the Incan ruins of Killarumiyoq. Apu Sunqomarca is our spiritual reference point. We walk to a stone carving in a solid rock face that represents the moon, and there, we perform cleansing rituals under a small waterfall. Then, we climb to the temple of the moon, Killarumiyoq, where the Aynikarpay initiation ceremony and hatun despacho are performed. You receive your first mesiq'epe, the aynipampamisa.
- Snack on fruit.
- Return to Cusco for lunch.
- Rest or on your own in Cusco.
- Dinner.
- Evening Integration.

Day 15 (Oct. 26) Cusco, Misawork

- Breakfast
- Misawork at Ayniwasi: The three aspects of Ayni, the significance of your aynikarpay initiation, and the organization and care of your misa. Learn your shamanic energy of lloqay, panya, or llantin.
- Return to Cusco for lunch.
- Rest or on your own in Cusco, excursions available.
- Dinner.
- Evening integration.

Day 16 (Oct. 27) Depart Cusco and return to Lima for flight home. This is for those returning to Lima, who were part of the signature tour. Those coming for the aynikarpay only will have the opportunity for further instruction and training.

- Breakfast.
- Transport to airport.
- Flight to Lima, bus to Miraflores, and check into hotel (day room) with afternoon shopping in Lima, dinner on your
 own, re-group at hotel, and transport to airport for flight home in the morning. Museum and other excursions are
 available.

MEET YOUR LEADERS

Santiago (Dr. J. E. Williams) has worked with traditional indigenous people since 1967 and has been with the Q'ero for more than a decade. He is the author of *The Andean Codex* and *Light of the Andes*, and founder of Ayniglobal, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization preserving indigenous culture, lands, and peoples.

Sebastian Pauccar Flores is a hatun pampamisayoq from a long line of Q'ero shamans. He is the president of Ayniwasi, a residential and healing center in Tica Tica, near Cusco. Sebastian is available for private healing sessions and coca leaf readings.

Nicolas Pauccar Calcina is Sebastian's eldest son and a vibrant, new-generation leader among the Q'ero. He is spreading the message of Ayni to other countries in Latin America and in Europe.
